You can also program the unit to automatically light anytime, making it a much more inviting way to wake up than an alarm clock.

Gas and electric fireplaces have come a long way. Today their appearance is so convincing that it often takes a second look to distinguish them from the wood-burning variety. In addition, several gas and electric fireplaces have now been sized specifically for use in bathrooms, bedrooms and other intimate spaces. Although these mini-fireplaces have the capability of warming up a chilly room, they are designed to be used year 'round and in warm climates. Often the purpose is to create that special ambience that comes from firelight and glowing embers.

If you need the crackling and popping of burning wood in order to evoke the nostalgia you desire, some gas and electric fireplaces have those realistic sounds included as a part of the operation of the appliance. Or, you can purchase a CD recording and have it merrily snap-crackling in the background.

When purchasing a fireplace, consider the following:

- ❖ Direct vent gas fireplaces do not need a foundation or a chimney, as do wood-burning fireplaces. They burn efficiently and vent any combustion byproducts and moisture straight through the wall to the outside, preserving indoor air quality. Thermostatic and remote controls are often available.
- ❖ Electric fireplaces are convenient and flexible. They don't require a chimney, vent or gas line. You simply plug them into a 110 electrical outlet. They can be moved from room to room, as you please. They operate with or without heat. ■

The Corner Wall Mount electric fireplace conveniently fits into corner areas that are not typically used in a room. It comes with a 3-stage remote control, and the flames operate independently from the heater for year 'round use.

Shoes can be slid underneath the elevated bench and out of the traffic path.

If you find yourself stumbling over jackets and shoes left in disarray at the back entry, or desperately trying to locate your phone bill in the piles of mail you dumped on the kitchen counter as you walked in, you need to get your home's entrance organized. There's no better way to do that than with cabinets.

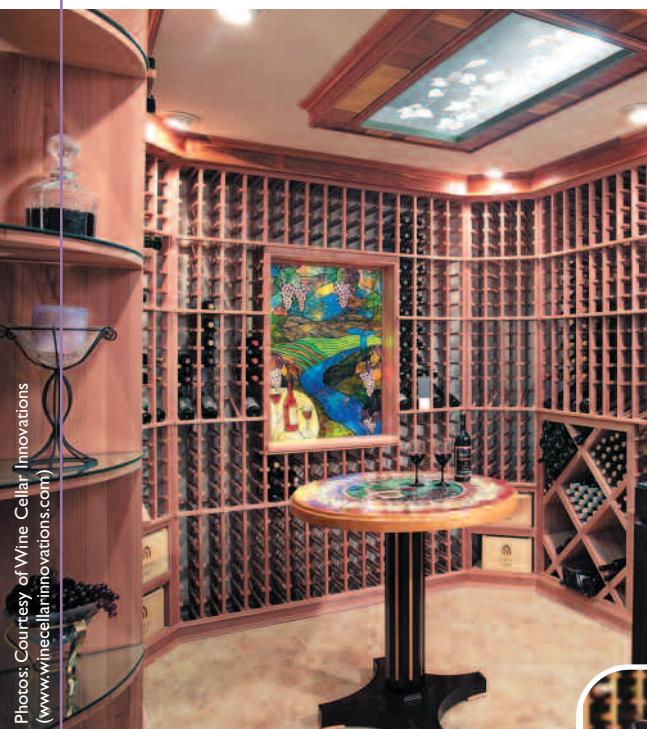

Wine, unlike most food, is alive. It is constantly breathing and changing as it reacts to its environment. Some wines are best enjoyed while they still have their youth and freshness. Others need to age gracefully in order to reach their potential of full-bodied flavor. For that reason those who really care about their wine collections, whether large or small, will want to provide the ideal conditions for storing their wine, allowing it to improve and then keeping it at its peak for years to come.

Basically, wine needs to be stored in a dark, cool, humid, well-ventilated area that is free from vibrations and has a relatively constant temperature. Table wine should be stored horizontally to keep the cork moist, whereas fortified wines are stored standing. Of all these requirements, temperature is the most crucial. The optimum temperature is 50 to 55°F (10-12°C). However, any constant temperature within 40-65°F (5-18°C) will do. The traditional underground wine cellar has offered the perfect wine storage solution for centuries, ever since the ancient Romans began wine production.

Having an underground cellar is not always an option for today's homeowners, nor does it always fit their busy lifestyles. Many people value the convenience of having their wine collection stored adjacent to the kitchen or dining room. If your collection consists of just a few choice bottles, then a refrigerated wine

cabinet in the kitchen might be ideal for you. These cabinets also function well as secondary units to a wine cellar, providing a short-term storage option for bottles you plan to drink in the near future.

For larger collections, consider installing a self-contained walk-in storage unit or building your own custom wine room. These rooms can be insulated, ventilated, and refrigerated to provide ideal wine storage conditions above ground. Electronic inventory tracking systems, employing touch screen monitors, assist you in managing your collection. With a tracking system you can be assured of having the right wine at the right time, choosing it only after it has been allowed to reach its full maturity. When properly stored, your wine collection can give you and your guests many years of pleasure and satisfaction. ■
